Although this approach is well established in New Testament textual criticism, it is in its infancy in the textcritical study of the Hebrew Bible. Building on the recent appearance of the volume *Biblical Quotations and Allusions in Second Temple Jewish Literature* (Göttingen 2011), this symposium will explore methodological questions on how to textcritically study quotations and allusions to Jewish scriptures in Ancient Jewish and cognate literatures.
